3. APPROVAL OF VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

The House approved the Votes and Proceedings of Tuesday 16th February, 2021 (4th Rajab 1442. A.H) **as presented**

4. KANO STATE CHILD'S PROTECTION BILL, 2021 (1442 A.H.)

Mr. Clerk read Kano State Child's Protection Bill, 2021 (1442 A.H.) **for the 1st time.**

Analysis

- **Child Right Bill is very important to the life of child; the National Assembly has also passed Child Right act in 2003.**
- **Children and young people have the same general human rights as adults and also specific rights that recognize their special needs.**

- **Children are neither the property of their parents nor are they helpless objects of charity. They are human beings and are the subject of their own rights.**
- **The Convention on the Rights of the Child sets out the rights that must be realized for children to develop to their full potential.**
- **The Convention of the right of the child offers a vision of the child as an individual and as a member of a family and community, with rights and responsibilities appropriate to his or her age and stage of development. By recognizing children's rights in this way, the Convention firmly sets the focus on the whole child.**
- **The Convention of the right of the child recognizes the fundamental human dignity of all children and the urgency of ensuring their well-being and development. It makes clear the idea that a basic quality of life should be the right of all children, rather than a privilege enjoyed by a few.**

5. ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Motion made and question proposed that, the House call on the State Government to construct a road from Balan-Watsawa all in Kabo Local Government Area

The Chief Whip emphasized the importance of the road construction to the residents of these areas from the economic social and security point of view and urged the Honorable House to support the Motion presented

The construction of the road is very significant in that area. The road connected a number of Local Governments. The Hon. Member informed the House that, the state government is presently constructing a road from Kanya to Kabo which

would bring succor to the residents of Balan-Watsawa. He urged the Honorable Members to support the motion.

ANALYSIS

- **The significance of road construction could not be overemphasized. It facilitates daily economic and social activities in the state. Such as transportation, health, education and agriculture and these stimulate economic and social development.**
- **Road constructions provide access to employments and help to fight against poverty.**
- **Modernization in all aspects of humanity especially in the rural areas requires construction of access roads and transport services.**

Resolution

By unanimous resolution, the House approved the motion.

ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Motion made and question proposed that, the House call on the State Government to construct a road from Badawa Bus Stop – Ring road in Nassarawa Local Government Area – **Hon. Umar Musa Gama (Nassarawa)**.

The Honorable Member recounted the importance of constructing the road to the people of these areas. He also stated that the sufferings being experienced by the people particularly during rainy seasons. He therefore called on the State Government to construct the roads.

Contribution

Hon. Hayatu Musa D/Sallau; Kura G/Mallam; (Majority Whip)

The Majority Whip explained the importance of the road; it linked Hadeja road and other roads. He supported the motion and urged the Government to construct the road.

ANALYSIS

- **Road transport passengers and carry goods regardless of distance directly to a destination.**
- **Road transport and its infrastructure enable to carry people as well as materials, raw materials, semi-finished and finished products intended for sale. Road infrastructure affects the flexibility and mobility of the workforce, which is reflected in the employment level.**
- **The degree to which the road infrastructure is developed has an impact on several areas, such as for instance the development of tourism, influx of foreign investments, regional development, facilitate access to markets schools' hospitals etc.**

Resolution

By unanimous resolution, the House approved the motion.

COMPLETING DAMBATTA STADIUM

Motion made and question proposed that, the House call on the State Government to complete the construction of Dambatta Stadium in Dambatta Local Government Area – **Hon. Murtala Musa Kore** (*Dambatta*).

He stressed the importance of the motion and advised that all Local Governments in the state should have its Stadium owing to the social role played by the stadia in our lives particularly the youngsters.

Analysis

- **Hosting sporting events in a stadium can boost tourism and revenue for the government and thus create employment opportunities.**
- **Stadium encourages physical activities like sports, for recreational, professional and educational purposes, they are an essential building block of a prosperous and healthy society. Much like a country's educational system, media or political and social movements.**
- **Stadiums serve as avenues for strengthening unity and social cohesion**

Resolved:

Hon. Abdullahi Iliyasu Yaryasa, Deputy Majority Leader (*T/Wada*) proposed to form an Ad-hoc Committee to visit the site to assess the level of the construction of the stadium.
