VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS
TUESDAY 23RD FEBRUARY, 2021
(11TH RAJAB, 1442 A.H.)**

1. The House met at 10:36 a.m. Mr. Speaker took his seat and read prayers.

2. **APPROVAL OF VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS**

Mr. Speaker announced that, he had examined the **Votes and Proceedings of Monday 22nd February, 2021 (10th Rajab, 1442 A.H.)**.

Question put and agreed to.

Motion made and question proposed that, the House do now adopt the **Votes and Proceedings of Monday 22nd February, 2021 (10th Rajab, 1442 A.H.)** - Hon. Labaran Abdul Madari, Majority Leader (*Warawa*).

Seconded by Hon. Sale Ahmed Marke (*D/Tofa*).

By unanimous consent, the **Votes and Proceedings of Monday 22nd February, 2021 (10th Rajab, 1442 A.H.)** were approved as **presented**.

3. REPORT PRESENTATION

Motion made and question proposed that, the House do allow for report presentation of the Ad-hoc Committee on Finance and that of Local Government and Chieftaincy Affairs in respect of low revenue generation in the 44 Local Government Areas of the State – **Hon. Magaji Dahiru Zarewa (Rogo)**.

Seconded by **Hon. Musa Ali Kachako (Takai)**.

Question put and **agreed to.**

Thereupon, **Hon. Magaji Dahiru Zarewa (Rogo)** Chairman Ad-hoc Committee on Finance and that of Local Government and Chieftaincy Affairs, Ordered to present the report to the House.

Report accordingly **presented.**

Question proposed.

Debate arising.

Resolved:

The House has adopted the report and approved the following recommendations:

1. The House to review of existing Revenue Laws to meet the current situation and be in line with international best practice

2. The Local Government Councils should provide revenue database
3. The State Government to provide laws for Local Government level to enforce measures to comply with by producing operational guidelines
4. The Local Government to strengthen revenue unit/committee for efficient and effective revenue assessment and collection.
5. The Local Government to collaborate with all relevant stakeholders to ensure collection of validated data
6. The Ministry for Local Government to organize a joint retreat with relevant stakeholders (House of Assembly, Ministry of Finance, State Internal Revenue Service, Ministry for Local Government, Civil Society Organizations, Unionists and Media so as to share views, brainstorm, identify gaps and solve differences in accordance with relevant laws
7. The Local Government Councils should not engage any Consultant in revenue assessment and collection but only be limited to technical advisory services (where necessary)
8. The Local Government to ensure transparency and accountability in assessing, collection and accounting of revenue in accordance with relevant laws
9. The Local Government Councils should ensure that all payments are paid through and other means of payments channels e.g., POS, while in the long run there is need for full automation of assessment and collection process.

10. The Ministry for Local Government to ensure effective and efficient implementation of relevant revenue laws.
11. The State Government should ensure payment of 10% of internally generated revenue collected by the state to 44 Local Government as specified by the Law
12. The Local Government Councils should ensure continuous advocacy and public enlightenment on general revenue administration via radio jingles. Pamphlets traditional rulers, religious leaders etc.
13. The Local Government should stop leasing of revenue assessment and collection to enhance regular cash flow at Local Government.
14. The Local Government Councils should make use of daily abstract of revenue and expenditure book.
15. The Local Government Councils to centralized the production of all Revenue Receipts to Government Printing Press.
16. The Hon. House to enact law that will empower the State Government to administer revenue collection in all the 44 Local Government Councils as being practiced in Kaduna, Lagos and Rivers States as leading revenue generating States in the nation; and additional recommendation as:
17. The House Committee on Local Government and Chieftaincy Affairs should follow up the procedure for leasing in all the 44 Local Government Areas in the State.

4. MANDATORY SCREENING TESTS FOR THE INTENDED MARRIAGE COUPLES

Motion made and question proposed that, the House call on the State Government to as a matter of public health importance, make a policy that will mandate all intending marriage couples to undergo a mandatory screening tests for HIV, Hepatitis B and Genotype as focal health challenge for control prior to wedding fatiha and engagement in the State -

Seconded by **Hon. Hayatu Musa D/Sallau**, Majority Whip (*Kura/G/Malam*).

Debate arising.

Resolved:

The House call on the State Government to make a policy that will mandate all intending marriage couples to undergo a mandatory screening tests for HIV, Hepatitis B and Genotype as focal health challenge for control prior to wedding fatiha and engagement in the .

Question put and **agreed to.**

5. ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Motion made and question proposed that, that the House call on the State Government to construct a road from Kwanar Juma – Juma – Rano – Jalabi Zango – Satigal – Tudun Gaji – Kulluwa – Rano way all in Bunkure and Rano Local Government Areas. - **Hon. Muhammad Uba Gurjiya** (*Bunkure*)

Hon. Nuraddeen Alasan Ahmad (*Rano*)

Seconded by **Hon. Nuhu Abdullai Achika** (*Wudil*).

Amendments proposed to delete “**Rano**” and insert “**Ran**” and to delete “**way**” and insert “**road**” instead thereof. **Hon. Hayatu Musa D/Sallau, Majority Whip** (*Kura/G/Malam*).

Amendments put and **agreed to.**

Resolved:

The House call on the State Government to construct a road from Kwanar Juma – Juma – Ran – Jalabi Zango – Satigal – Tudun Gaji – Kulluwa – Rano road all in Bunkure and Rano Local Government Areas.

Question put and **agreed to.**

6. MATTER OF URGENT PUBLIC IMPORTANCE

Motion made and question proposed that, the House call on the State Government to as a matter of urgency, direct Kano Road Traffic Agency (KAROTA) to stop issuing new registration to Tricycle (A DAIDAITA SAHU) in the State – **Hon. Garba Ya’u Gwarmai** (*Kunchi/Tsanyawa*).

Seconded by **Hon. Nuhu Abdullahi Achika** (*Wudil*)

Debate arising.

Resolved:

- i) The House call on the State Government to direct KAROTA to stop issuing new registration to Tricycle riders/owners in the State.
- ii) The House call on the State Government to sanitize the system in order to correspond with religion and culture of Kano State citizens.
- iii) The State Government to provide township Buses in order to ease transportation in the State.
- iv) The House to amend the Kano Road Traffic Agency (KAROTA) Law in order to enlighten the general public on the benefit of Tricycle in providing jobs to our teeming youth in the State and also provide discipline to the riders.
- v) The House Committee on Housing and Transport should investigate the matter and report back to the House.
